

"We are very excited to welcome Larry Tausch to the Northwest Community. He will be a great fit and an asset to the district."



Wrion Bowling, a 2004 graduate of Northwest High School, has won the attention of local film enthusiasts with his recent film, "Shelter." The film will be shown at a special screening held by Akron Film+Pixel June 23 at 8:30 p.m. at Summit ArtSpace on East Market Street in Akron. The film is free and open to the public.

Although the film has not received an official MPAA rating, it does contain elements that may not be suitable for children.

Bowling and his collaborator, Adam Caudill, wrote, produced, directed, and edited the film as a team. The film is about five survivors forced to live in a secret underground bomb shelter for more than a year. The film was shot entirely in Akron. The film has a small ensemble cast, and Joyce Hshieh, a 2005 Northwest alumna, has the lead role.

Bowling's interest in movie-making began with his short videos for Ms. Shannon Stacy's English class, and he first began to sense that he might want to pursue film and television as a career option in Mr. John Rafailedes's class, Electronic Media. After his graduation from Northwest in 2004, he enrolled at Ohio University to study video production. At OU he had the opportunity to write and direct many projects, including short films, sitcoms,

and even an actual evening news program, broadcast on WOUB for Southeast Ohio and West Virginia.

Bowling stresses that his work on "Shelter" was a collaboration of efforts, and he believes being in the high school marching band

taught him "valuable lessons: the ability to lead a team, the experience of collaborating with others toward a larger creative goal, and the importance of individual practice – often tedious, but always rewarding. For this, I am forever indebted to Mr. Garry Masowich."

Wrion currently lives with his wife Carissa in New York City where he works as a freelance video editor. He and Caudill are putting the finishing touches on "Shelter," focusing on promoting it and starting to write their next project.





Sheepskin Replaced by Parchment

The diplomas received by the Class of 2012 are printed on parchment, but those diplomas issued a century ago were printed on sheepskin. Visitors to the Rhoads-Harter House in Clinton have an opportunity to see the actual sheepskins of two graduates of the Clinton School Class of 1894. These diplomas belonged to John P. Rhoads and Della (Dreurey) Sours. The two graduates were part of a graduating class of four students that included Lewis Hertle and Minnie (Klein) Ruch.

The use of sheepskins by universities has declined over the past few years, with Notre Dame most recently announcing the move to parchment. Why are universities moving from

the traditional sheepskin? A parchment diploma costs about \$15 while a sheepskin diploma ranges between \$135-200.
