Race to the Top Update

As we finalize year four of our Race to the Top (RttT) Grant, we are evaluating the impact of the district's scope of work on the students, teachers and administrators. The district has revised the curriculum and instruction to be focused on the implementation of 21st century learning skills, developed shared leadership and accountability for the academic success of students who attend our schools and optimized resources in order to deliver a premier educational experience. The district has completed the following activities:

Assurance Area A: Transformation Team and Communication

• Reviewed the RttT initiatives and analyzed the impact on students, teachers and administrators on a quarterly basis. Communicated progress to all stakeholders throughout the four-year process

Assurance Areas B: Standards and Assessments

- Revised local curriculum to align with Ohio's New Learning Standards
- Trained staff members in the use of assessment strategies
- Integrated formative and summative assessments into daily instruction
- Reviewed Ohio's new assessment blueprints and test specifications preparing for implementation during the 2014-2015 school year

Assurance Area C: Using Data to Drive Instruction

- · Participated in professional development on the implementation of new state assessments
- Implemented the use of the Instructional Improvement System (IIS)

Assurance Area D: Great Teachers and Leaders

- Distributed and utilized value-added reports for teachers and principals to inform professional development and identify areas of need
- Evaluated existing student growth measures and developed growth measures in subjects and grade levels that do not have statewide standardized tests

- Implemented the Resident Educator Mentoring Program

Northwest Participates in Online Assessment Field Testing

During the 2014-2015 school year, Ohio will replace the Ohio Academic Assessments (OAAs) in third through eighth grade with online assessments. During the 2018-2019 school year, the Ohio Graduation Tests (OGT) will be replaced with online end-of-course exams and new graduation requirements. The district has been selected to participate in the field-testing of Ohio's new online assessments, which will occur this spring. The subject areas the district will field test include high school Algebra 1, high school English 11, fourth and sixth-grade social studies and fifth and eighth-grade science. Our students have the opportunity to experience online testing while developing an understanding of the testing format and the computer skills that will be required to complete Ohio's new online assessments. The district will utilize the data gathered during field-testing to prepare for the implementation of online assessments during the upcoming school year.



Plans for Canal Fulton YMCA moving Forward

The Canal Fulton YMCA has offered a variety of programming over recent years, and this programming has been offered without a YMCA facility. The Canal Fulton YMCA Board of Trustees is holding bi-monthly meetings to determine community interest in such a building. The Canal Fulton City Council has held two public meetings to gauge public interest, and the response has been quite positive. In response, the City Council did approve for a YMCA building to be built on the land that is on Locust between the Police/ Fire Station and the NW Senior Center, and the YMCA of Central Stark County is continuing to pursue the goal of building a Y.

Associate Executive Director of the David YMCA, Pam Leddon, says, "The Y provides financial assistance for everything we offer: childcare, t-ball and group exercise. The Canal Fulton YMCA alone has provided almost \$8,000 over the last 2 years, 2012 and 2013. We have only raised about \$2700 to help with this. Our Y Promise is to never turn anyone away due to the inability to pay. In 2013 the Canal Fulton Y provided 8 children from 6 families with financial assistance throughout the year. Our Annual Support Campaign is a major part of the YMCA and the Y is a non-profit, charitable organization."

Ms. Leddon also suggested that residents should watch for a Canal Fulton Y Facebook page which will be up and running very soon.

The Y has been providing programming for a variety of ages even now: Before and After School Childcare for K - 5th graders at the

Primary School, Adult Group Exercise Classes at the Saltbox Ministry building, Silver Sneaker Exercise classes at the NW Stark Senior Center, Summer Y Fun Days for K - 5th graders at Stinson, 3 1/2 - 6-year-old T-ball at St. Helena Heritage Park. In addition, the Y is giving the students who are recognized every 6 weeks or so at Stinson for a specific Character Value a free

guest pass to the David Y and a YMCA Character Counts bookmark. The Y has also participated in the Northwest Community Days and Olde Canal Days. Currently, the David Y is providing swim lessons to fourth-graders.

A total of 136 fourth-graders from Stinson are taking 6 weeks of swim lessons at the David YMCA. They are grouped by classroom, Monday through Friday for one hour each day. The first week YMCA instructors evaluated every child's swim ability and then for the next five weeks the children were broken



into smaller groups and a YMCA swim instructor did a swim lesson with each group. "We found that 73% of the kids had little or no swim ability (classified as beginners); 20% had some swim abilities, but were still not great swimmers and were unable to swim 25 yards on their own yet; and 7% are good swimmers and could be on a youth swim team," says Pam Leddon. "The kids have been great, respectful, nice and just a joy to have here at the Y. We have heard comments that this is the best day when they get to come and swim at the Y. The Y is excited to be able to offer this program to the Northwest fourth-graders."

Kiss the Pig: another Successful Year

Thanks to Northwest Primary's annual "Kiss the Pig" event, over \$1,000 was collected for the Wounded Warriors Project, which helps thousands of injured warriors returning from the battlefield by providing assistance to their families. Each class had a collection jar that looks like a pig. Unfortunately, the scheduled pig ran off; therefore, the pig was replaced with a goat. The top classes were Mrs. Williamson, Mrs. Salle and Ms. Brunner. Each winning teacher was given a chance to "klss the goat."

Gina Huscusson named as Northwest Representative to the All-Stark County Teaching Team



When asked how she feels about being selected as Northwest's representative of the All-Stark County Teaching Team, Gina Huscusson responds that she feels "Very honored and surprised. There are a lot of excellent teachers in the Northwest district." A 14-year veteran of this district, Mrs. Huscusson previously taught for 6 years at Manchester High School before returning to her alma mater.

Mrs. Huscusson is a leader in the high school's math department, and she currently teaches Algebra 2, PreCalculus and AP Calculus. She believes that two major challenges face high school math teachers at this time: "Implementing the new Common Core Standards in Mathematics and preparing our students for the new end-of-course exams are the current challenges we face."

Principal Eric Bornstine considers Mrs. Huscusson to be a vital member of the high school faculty: "Mrs. Huscusson continues to maintain a student focus. Her expectations of the students are rigorous, and she works diligently to provide support to ensure student success. Her interactions with students, parents, and fellow staff members showcase her integrity and commitment. She is an outstanding educator who challenges and supports her students to excel."

Returning to teach at Northwest has special meaning for Mrs. Huscusson: "I am a graduate of Northwest High School. Because of the outstanding teachers and a wonderful guidance counselor that I had, I was able to attend and graduate from college debt-free with several academic scholarships. I felt that I was more than prepared for college with the excellent education that I received from Northwest. I try to encourage my students every year to challenge themselves in high school (while their education is free) so that they will be prepared in college (when they are paying for their education). Every student here can get the same outstanding education because the teachers in Northwest District are outstanding. I am proud to have come back to my home district to teach, and now living in Canal Fulton, my own children will have the same opportunities that I had."

Mrs. Huscusson and her husband have three sons, Cameron, Nathan, and Zachary.

Mr. Shawn Donaldson, who teaches Computer Applications and Computer Programming, has been selected Northwest's "Rookie of the Year." A graduate of Kent State University, he earned his Master's Degree in Secondary Education from Grand Canyon University. Teaching at Northwest is his first full-time teaching position. Mr. Donaldson is pleased to join our district: "Being a graduate of Dover High, I have been quite familiar with Northwest and the students and staff. It was not until I began working here that I realized how accepting and helpful they are. The student body has been great, and I have been really impressed."

Principal Eric Bornstine says that "Mr. Donaldson has quickly assimilated into Northwest High School. He is passionate and enthusiastic about his subject area of technology. He is earning the respect of the students and fellow staff members for his knowledge and ability to assist them in the area of technology. Outside the classroom he is becoming a leader with our student athletes, assisting with their growth on and off the field." Mr. Donaldson says his goal is to become a strong teacher: "My goals for the future are to continue getting better as an educator and do whatever I can to help the Northwest School District."

Symphonic Band and Varsity Choir head to State Competition

At the recent OMEA District Contests held at Lake High School, the Northwest Symphonic Band, under the direction of Mrs. Aaron Welker, recently received a superior rating and a chance to move on to the OMEA State Contest. In fact, Northwest received superior ratings from all three judges, and the band was one of only three schools to do so. The judges rated each band on their prepared musical selections on a variety of aspects, including tone, blend, balance, style, musicianship and overall playing. The band then played for a sight-reading judge as the students were required to play a piece that they had never seen before. The band will perform in the state contest May 2 held at GlenOak. Northwest Local Schools will host the East Region School Bus Safety Road-e-o on Saturday, May 3, 2014, at Northwest High School. The safety competition is sponsored by the Ohio Association of Pupil Transportation and takes place annually

EARNED Income Tax

When the community passed the 1% Earned Income Tax in 2010, we made promises to the community, promises that we have kept over the past four years:

- We have not rehired staff members who were laid off due to the financial crisis, except to replace employees who left because of retirement or resignation.
- We have not reduced class sizes. •

- We have not increased the number of credits required for graduation. •

- We have eliminated outstanding debt and removed the district from the designation of • **Fiscal Caution.**
- We have reinstated extra-curricular and co-curricular activities.
- We have provided professional development for all staff in every classroom. •
- We offer all-day, every day kindergarten for all children. •
- We have halted additional staff reductions.
- We have provided fiscal stability.

Passing the renewal of the 1% Earned Income Tax is ESSENTIAL to maintain the school district's current program.

INDEPENDENT FINANCIAL OVERSIGHT GROUP ENDORSES RENEWAL OF THE 1% EARNED INCOME TAX

April 2, 2014

Dear Northwest Residents:

We, as members of the Independent Community Financial Oversight Committee, made the recommendation for the 1% earned income tax that, thanks to community support, became the 2010 foundation for Your Plan. Your Vote.

It has been five years since this earned income tax levy was approved, and we must now consider its renewal.

Our Committee met to review and discuss the five-year School Budget forecast through June 30, 2018. We have concluded that although the 2014 Budget is currently in surplus, we must renew the 1% earned income tax to ensure the continued financial stability of our school district and to avoid another fiscal emergency. The committee believes that:

- 1. Since we are out of financial crisis,
- 2. Since we have excellent state academic scores,
- 3. Since our cost per student is the 3rd lowest in county,
- 4. Since our extra-curricular activities are intact,
- 5. Since this is not a new tax,

We need to continue the forward momentum. We've come too far to take a step backward.

Accordingly, the Independent Community Financial Oversight Committee recommends that the Community renew the 1% earned income tax for another five years.
