Respecting the worth and dignity of each individual, creating a safe learning environment.	DIGNITY: Bearing conduct or speech indicative of self-respect. Appreciation for an individual or situation. SAFE: Secure from liability, harm, danger or risk.	Do I treat everyone that I come into contact with with respect, the way that I would want to be treated? Do I understand that not all people have the same talents and that not all people are like me? Do I make sure that people around me feel not only physically safe, but emotionally safe as well?	
Equal and diverse educational opportunities for all students to prepare them to be competitive in a global market.	EQUAL: Balanced, sufficient, uniform, and alike in value. DIVERSE: Of different kind, form or character. OPPORTUNITIES: A situation or condition favorable for attaining a goal. A good position, chance or prospect.
