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## Mike Shreffler Named Superintendent

The Northwest Local Board of Education has awarded a three-year contract to Dr. Mike Shreffler as the new Superintendent of Schools.

Dr. Shreffler is currently in his fourth year as Superintendent of Southeast Local Schools in Wayne County. Previously, he served as the Director of Curriculum and a high school assistant principal in the Perry Local School District. His first eight years as an educator were in Florida as a teacher and an administrator.



Dr. Shreffler earned his bachelor's degree at the Ohio State University and his master's degree at the University of Akron. After earning his doctorate at Florida Atlantic University, he completed his coursework for his superintendent's license at Ashland University. He is a graduate of Central Catholic High School.

Dr. Shreffler is already an active participant in Stark County, as he has served as co-chair of Education Day for Leadership Stark County. He has also been a volunteer for Big Brothers/Big Sisters. He is the president of the nonprofit Ohio Regional Music, Arts and Cultural Outreach.

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## Northwest Local School District Receives Clean Audit from Auditor of State

The Northwest Local School District has received a clean audit report from Auditor of State Dave Yost for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011.

“We work hard each year to maintain sound accounting practices and exercise fiscal responsibility,” said Treasurer Dan Levengood. “Our responsibility is both to the students and the taxpayers and we are grateful for the Auditor’s recognition of our efforts.”

An audit reviews the financial statements of all governmental activities, each major fund and the aggregate remaining fund information for the district. An audit includes examining the evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also assesses the accounting principles used and evaluates the overall financial statement presentation.

Last June, Northwest was released from fiscal caution status by the Ohio Department of Education. The district has also refinanced all of the bonds sold in 2002, saving the district approximately \$1.9 million. And, a number of new construction and renovation projects are taking place at no cost to the taxpayers.

“Northwest has come a long way in the last two years,” said Superintendent Bill Stetler. “The Independent Finance Committee set the foundation to improve our finances, and Mr. Levengood has worked tirelessly to ensure the district remains fiscally responsible.”

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## Teachers “Unwrap” Learning Expectations

Northwest educators, as well as educators in school districts across the state of Ohio, are busy “unwrapping” the package of learning expectations referred to as “Common Core State Standards.” These educators are comparing them to those state standards adopted in 2002 and determining how to incorporate the new standards into the curriculum effectively. Northwest teachers used a recent in-service day to study the new standards in relation to the material they presently teach. Kindergarten teacher, Tiffany Cocklin, sees value in common standards, “The Common Core allows teachers to focus more directly on the students’ unique learning styles and allows teachers to address fewer topics more thoroughly.” Cliff Holcomb, also a kindergarten teacher, says the common standards “make certain that all students have the same education.”

According to “The Future Ready Project,” “The Common Core State Standards were developed collaboratively and involved 48 states, hundreds of experts and thousands of educators.” Writing and review committees were composed of teachers, content experts and higher education faculty. The standards were examined by over 10,000 stakeholders, many of them educators, to provide feedback before the final standards were validated by an expert committee prior to their release in June 2010. The Common Core Standards are designed to make education more rigorous because Ohio is presently using a system based upon minimum standards. Because our goal is to prepare graduates for college and a career, we must employ standards which will ensure that our students possess the knowledge and the skills essential for success.

These standards in Mathematics, English Language Arts and

Literacy in History/Social Studies, Science and Technical Subjects are to be implemented during the 2014-2015 school year.

These Common Core State Standards will be tied directly to the end of the year standardized assessments that will evaluate student learning. The biggest change with the new testing is that students will be asked open-ended questions that will require

students to think critically. In fact, educators in the participating states are also collaborating on common assessments as well as curricular and instructional materials. On the local level, teachers are developing common assessment tools to measure student progress on each of the standards. Much of the training our teachers are receiving is funded through the federal Race to the Top grant.

The implementation of these common standards, instruction and assessments will provide a solid foundation for local school districts. The benefit is that all students will be held to the same expectations and will be provided with a world-class education.

### What do the new state changes mean for students?

- The standards will provide a clear understanding of what students are expected to learn so teachers and parents know what they must do to help them.
- School districts have begun transitioning to the new standards during this school year with implementation beginning in 2013-2014.
- Ohio's new generation of assessments will be administered in 2014-2015.
- Standardized end-of-the-year assessments will be administered on the computer.

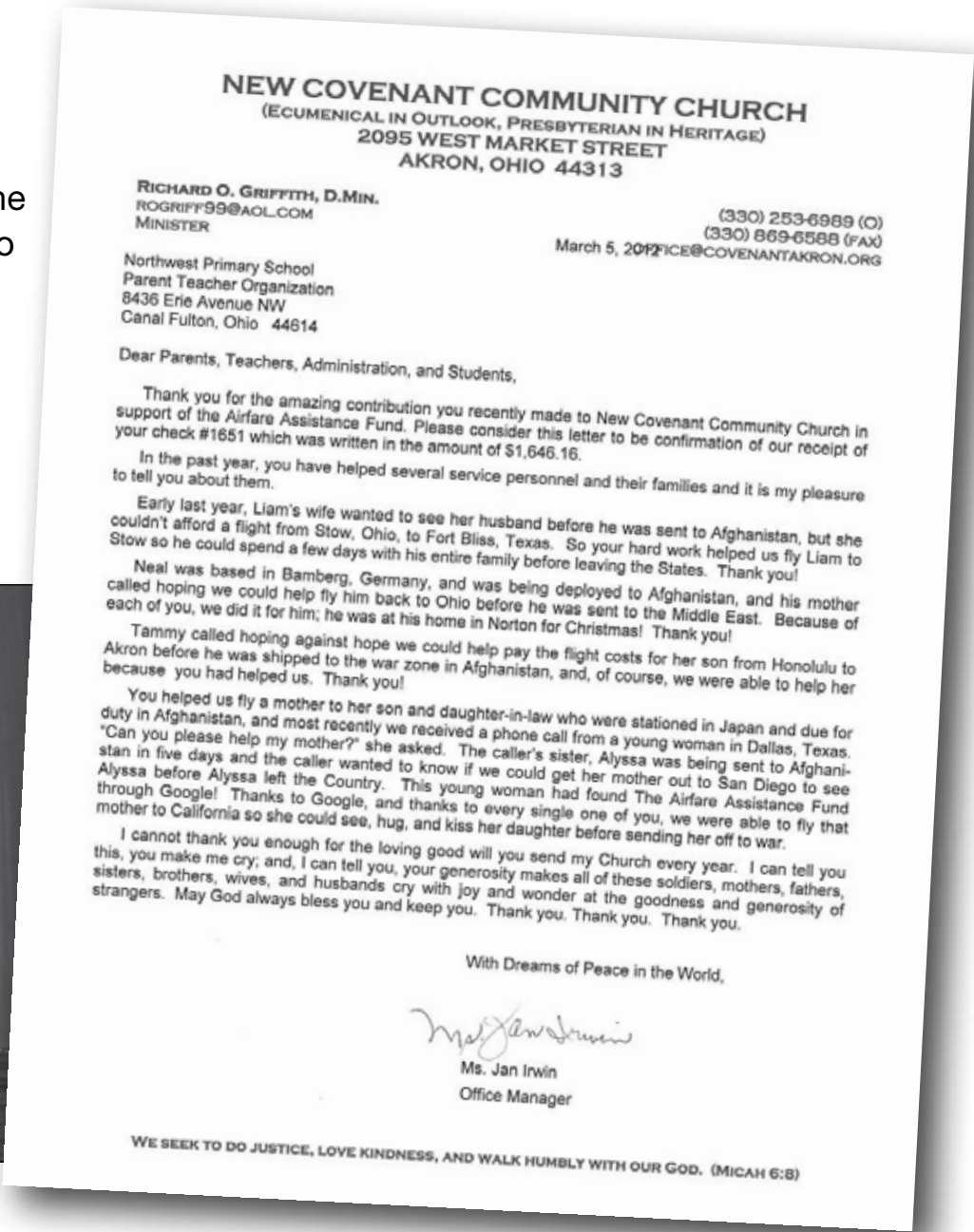
# “Kiss the Pig” a Success... Minus the Pig

## Heitger Throws Perfect Game

Junior Matt Heitger pitched a perfect game against Lake Center Christian March 29, leading the varsity baseball team to a 10-0 win. Matt struck out 14 batters, scored two runs and drove in three runs. Coach Brian Ries credited Matt's baseball acumen, "He got ahead in the count. He really kept them off-balanced with his off-speed pitches." Ries also gave credit to pitching coach John Johnson: "Props to John Johnson for calling a great game, also. He works with our pitchers and calls the pitches each game."

Matt's perfect game was only the 48th in Ohio high school baseball history since 1921. With approximately 7,000 high school games played each year in the state of Ohio, a perfect game is a rare feat.



## Physical Education Exemption for Class of 2014

The Northwest Board of Education recently took steps that will provide students an opportunity to waive the physical education requirement. According to the policy, "A student who, during high school, has participated in interscholastic athletics, marching band or cheerleading for at least two full seasons is not required to complete any physical education courses as a condition to graduate. However, the student is required to complete one-half unit, consisting of at least 60 hours of instruction, in another course of study. This provision begins with the class of 2014."



# Wrestling Program Reverses Record

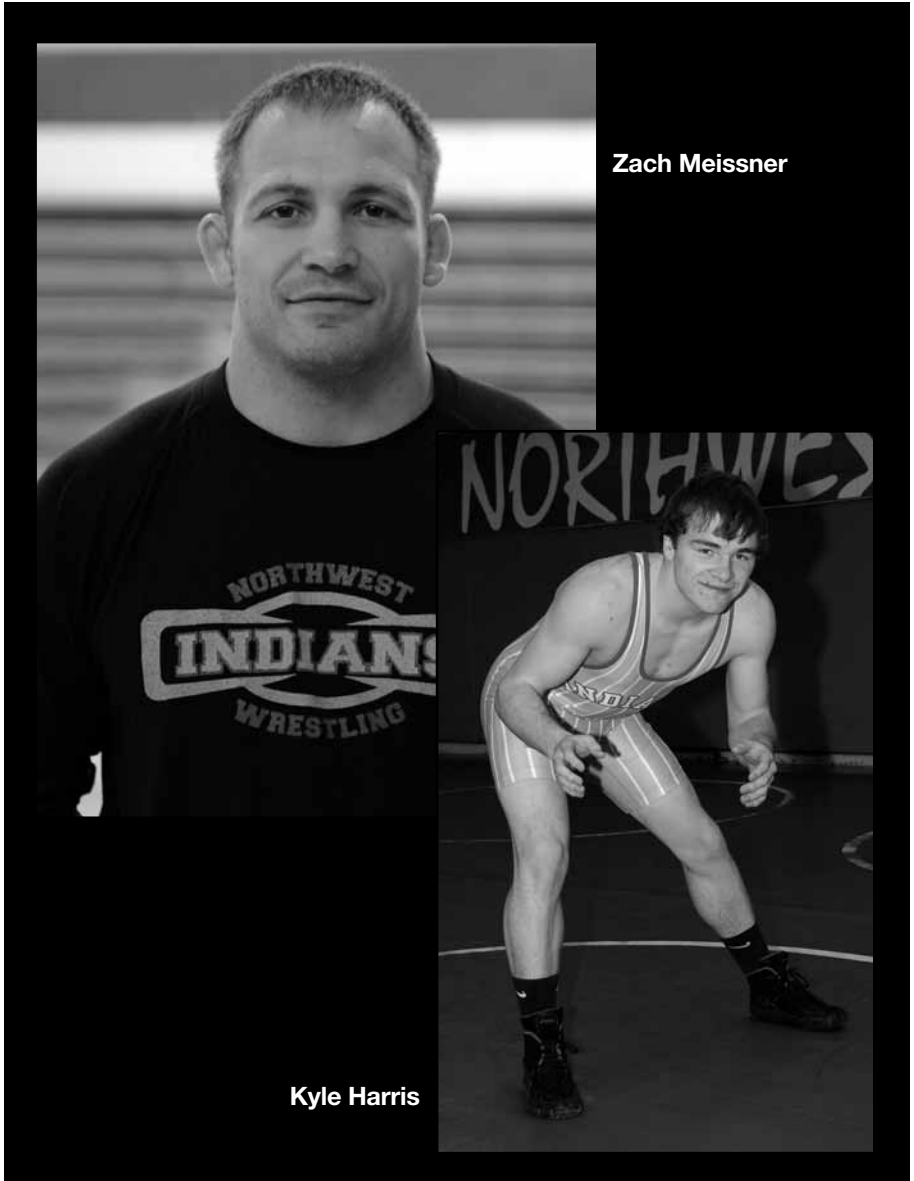
The Northwest High School wrestlers earned a 15-7 record for 2012 after experiencing a record of 3-16 in 2011. Seven wrestlers qualified to districts, and first-year head coach Zach Meissner is pleased that all but one of the wrestlers will return next year.

Meissner, a Jackson High School graduate, was a wrestling state champion in the 125-pound weight class in 2002. Meissner, currently a physical education teacher at Northwest Middle School, served as an assistant coach at Jackson for the past four years and is being inducted into the Stark County Wrestling Hall of Fame this spring. His assistant coaches are Dan Rooney, a 2-time state finalist from Walsh Jesuit, and Ray Kent, a state qualifier at Green High School. Meissner believes the success Northwest has enjoyed this year is due to the hands-on approach of

the coaches as they stress a positive attitude, high expectations and accountability. He says, “We know what it takes to be on top, and we try to convey that to the kids. They are starting to buy into it.”



Junior Kyle Harris has certainly learned that hard work leads to success. Kyle finished in eighth place in his first trip to the state wrestling tournament. Sectional Champ at 138 lbs., he finished fourth in the tough Alliance District to advance to the state tournament. He lost his first match to third-place finisher, Max Rohskopf of West Holmes, and battled back in consolation brackets to capture his eighth place finish. Kyle’s record for the year is 41-12.
