Northwest Fiscally Fit

The Northwest Local Schools Board of Education and administration made a pledge in 2010 to operate with a “fiscally responsible” approach. It is now two years later and the results are becoming apparent. The following items illustrate the strides Northwest Local has made toward becoming fiscally fit:

- School year 2011–2012 marks the third consecutive year that Northwest has spent less money than received. Conservative spending has moved us from being over a million dollars in debt and in State Fiscal Caution to having a cash balance equal to approximately one and one-half months of expenditures.
- The Building Fund, the fund used to construct the new primary building and the first phase of the high school construction, has had its debt reduced from approximately \$750,000 to a debt of less than \$200,000.
- We have refinanced all of the outstanding 2002 construction bonds. This undertaking will save taxpayers in the Northwest community approximately \$2 million over the next 17 years in real estate taxes.

- Participating in an Ohio School Facilities Project requires all schools to establish a separate Maintenance Fund. The fund’s sole purpose is to have cash available to keep the new and renovated schools in good and *sound* condition. Northwest Local is required to put \$ 139,000 into this fund annually. These funds have been transferred, and the school is in good standing with the OSFC regulations.
- We have begun to replace important assets that had been neglected previously. In school year 2011-2012 we were able to buy two new buses for the first time since 2006, replacing two buses with over 200,000 miles. These vehicles were beginning to cost the district large sums of money just to keep on the road. More importantly, the new buses are safer for our children.

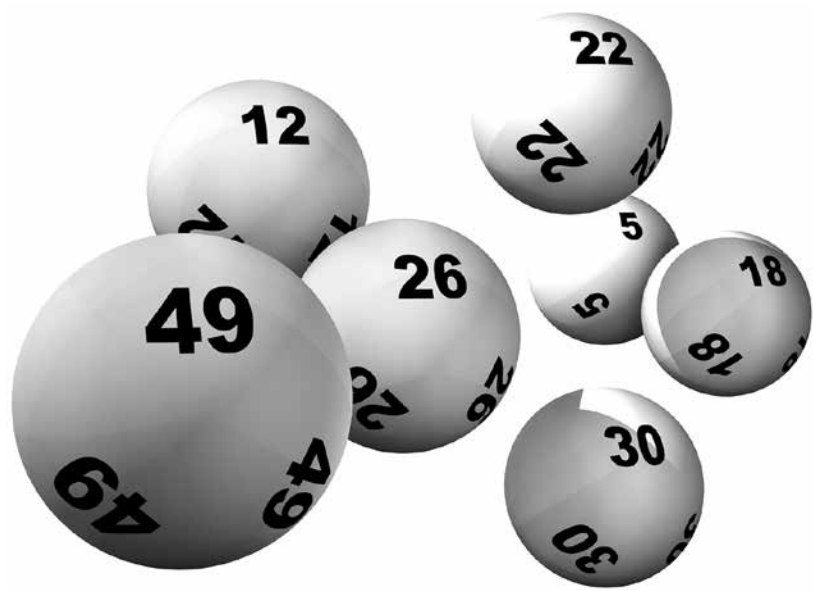
The overall financial stability of our school district has improved significantly over the last few years, and we will never fail to remember the pledge made in 2010 to be fiscally responsible.

Statewide Education Groups Setting the Record Straight on Lottery Profits

Three statewide education management groups representing Ohio's public school districts have released a statement in response to recent performance reports from the Ohio Lottery Commission. The Ohio School Boards Association (OSBA), the Buckeye Association of School Administrators (BASA) and the Ohio Association of School Business Officials (OASBO) want to set the record straight about lottery profits and their link to school funding.

Profits from the Ohio Lottery help the state fund education, and recent news reports implied that school districts would benefit substantially from increased lottery sales over the past year. The Ohio Lottery Commission issued a statement earlier this month touting a record sales year and a record year-end transfer to education in the state of Ohio. The three organizations cautioned, however, that the lottery's record-setting performance does not mean increases in funding to schools.

"While it is true that all Ohio Lottery profits are used by the state to fund education, the profit from increased sales was simply used to free up other state funds that had previously been set aside for schools, allowing more money to be transferred into the state's rainy day fund," said OSBA Executive Director Richard Lewis. "No increase in this year's funding for school districts will be available as a result of these unexpected profits."

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Curriculum News

New Writing Program

Teachers in grades four through twelve will begin using the Collins Writing Program during the upcoming school year. The Collins Writing Program is a model for writing-across-the-curriculum by defining five types of writing assignments and the outcomes expected for each type. The program is designed to help students achieve academically by requiring them to think on paper. This challenge is accomplished by using frequent, usually short, writing assignments to increase students' involvement in lessons, check on their understanding of concepts and promote their thinking about content. The program will be used to encourage them to reflect on what they are doing and to take responsibility for their own learning and understanding. The program will provide structure and continuity across grade levels and disciplines enabling the students to grow as thinkers and writers.

The Collins Writing program enables students to become comfortable thinking and writing, to develop the essential writing skills they need for future academic success, and to perform well on state and national assessments.

Race to the Top Update

During the 2011-2012 school year the district staff members focused on "unwrapping" the newly adopted Common Core Standards in reading and math and the Ohio Revised Science and Social Studies Standards. Teachers developed pacing guides and aligned curricular materials as they determined areas of need. A three-year plan was developed for the implementation of the new content standards by the 2014-2015 school year, which coincides with the implementation of new statewide assessments. The district also began the process of implementing the Resident Educator Program for newly hired teachers. This program provides four years of support and mentoring for new teachers with quality mentors and the guidance that is essential for developing their teaching skills.

The district will enter year three of its Race to the Top Grant during the upcoming school year. The focus of this year's work activities will include implanting the Common Core Standards in Reading and Math and the Ohio Revised Science and Social Studies Standards, identifying clear learning targets for each content area, developing and deploying common assessment practices and piloting a new teacher evaluation system.

Bus Safety is a Northwest Priority

The State Highway Patrol annually inspects school buses to ensure the safe transportation of Ohio's children. These inspections are carried out across the state during a 12 week period by 26 teams, and each team is responsible for inspecting one thousand buses. Northwest's inspection was conducted by a team from the Massillon Post of the State Highway Patrol, Trooper Joel Armstrong and Inspector Marvin Jose.

According to Transportation Coordinator Ray Gesaman, "The inspection team looks at the exterior, interior, engine compartment, undercarriage, brakes, and tires of the bus. Inspectors look for water and oil leaks, cracked or rusted sheet metal or frame

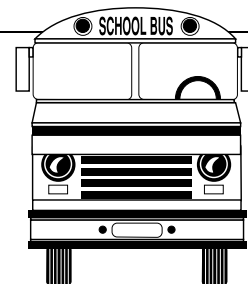

members, damage to hoses and wiring. Also, all lights and switches must work properly, and the interior floor and seats are also inspected."

Northwest's 22 buses passed inspection in early July, thanks to the efforts of Head Mechanic Kevin Litton and the transportation department who make certain Northwest children are safely transported to and from school, activities and athletic events. During the 2011-2012 school year, our buses traveled 290,565 miles.

Guidelines for High School Busing Exceptions



Once again, limited transportation of high school students may be provided for the 2012 – 2013 school year. After the first two weeks of school, busing levels will be reviewed to determine if any space is available.

Policy #EEAB

High School Transportation Exceptions

Despite the elimination of transportation for high school students, the Board will allow, only under the guidelines listed below, the limited transportation of high school students.

GUIDELINES:

- The student must make application to the director of transportation.
- There must be vacant seats on the bus.
- After the completion of the first two weeks of school, students will be assigned to the closest bus stop of a bus that has a vacant seat.
- Students will be assigned on a first come, first served basis - with ninth and tenth graders receiving first priority.

- There is no guarantee that such transportation will continue for the year or for subsequent years.
- No bus route or bus stops will be changed to accommodate a high school student.
- The decision to implement and/or to allow transportation under this policy is solely within the discretion of the Superintendent.

Busing applications will be provided to students on the first day of school and will also be posted on the high school website. Please be reminded that you will be responsible to provide transportation for your high school student until you receive confirmation that the application has been approved.

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Renovation and Construction Projects

Northwest Local became eligible for approximately \$30 million in 2008 for the building and renovation of the middle school, W.S. Stinson Elementary, and the high school. The money was received from the Ohio School Facilities Commission (OSFC), a department of the State of Ohio that received funding from a tobacco settlement. The facilities project is not covered through the local general fund.

The budget of the project was established cooperatively by a team of representatives from Northwest Local, the OSFC, and our

architectural firm, L/D Design group. Through this project the middle school has been renovated with an addition of approximately 12 thousand square feet at a cost of \$14 million. W.S. Stinson Elementary was renovated at a cost of \$12 million. The final portion of the OSFC money was used to add a gymnasium and two classrooms to the high school at a cost of \$4 million. The middle school and elementary buildings will be completed to begin this school year, and the high school gymnasium is scheduled for a November opening.

Northwest Middle School

Numerous skylights allow natural light in the hallways and classrooms, and the hallways are clean and bright with new lockers.



Science labs at the middle school contain 1200 square feet, abundant storage space and an emergency wash shower for safety.

Middle School Maintenance Room



The traditional “boiler room” has been replaced by a maintenance room. The maintenance area holds air handlers and heat pumps, and every classroom will have its own heat pump which will allow teachers to control the temperature in their classrooms.



Stinson Elementary



Stinson Elementary Classroom

The three grade levels are placed in their own areas which are marked by color: yellow for third grade, blue for fourth and red for fifth. Third-grade classrooms are located in what was Stinson, while the fourth-graders are on the second floor of what was the intermediate building and fifth-graders are on the first floor. Lockers have been replaced by “cubbies” in each classroom while teacher storage cabinets are placed in hallways to provide more classroom space.



A special education classroom in Stinson contains a collapsible wall which gives the teaching staff flexibility as they individualize learning.



Stinson Elementary Reception Area

The reception area in Stinson Elementary will welcome students and visitors to the building. Children, who are dropped off by parents, will enter at the front of the building into the reception area. Students, who are transported by buses, will enter through the back of the building into the reception area. This traffic pattern will provide a safe entrance for all students. Because safety is so important in our district, Stinson now has over 50 security cameras that will be monitored in the office to insure the safe learning environment.

A “cafetorium” in Stinson provides seating for lunch (cafeteria) and space for school performances (auditorium).



Northwest High School

The new construction at the high school will include a full gymnasium which will seat approximately 12 hundred fans. The gym is slated to open in November. The project includes two additional classrooms and an athletic office/ticket booth area.

The approaching school year is going to be an exciting time for students and staff of Stinson Elementary. We have a few construction hurdles to overcome, but the end result is going to be phenomenal.

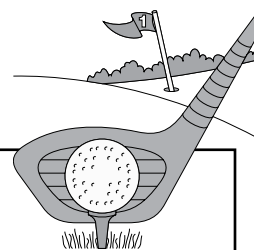
