Safety at Stinson

Visitors:

All doors to the building are locked when the school day begins and remain locked throughout the school day. Please buzz the bell when entering the main doors to be admitted into the office.

If visiting a classroom, please sign in and out and wear a visitor's badge. You will be asked to leave your driver's license with the secretary. Please call or email teachers before coming in for a meeting/conference. 24 hour notice is appreciated.

Parent Pick-up/Drop-off:

In order to make the pickup procedure as convenient and efficient as possible for parents, we are asking the parents who pick up their child every day or nearly every day to send in a letter notifying the office. Parents will remain in their cars while dropping off children in the morning and picking up at the end of the day. In the afternoon, cars will line up at the very top of the driveway. At 3:10, students will be dismissed to their cars.

In the mornings, we ask that you have your child exit the car anywhere in front of the school building. You do not need to pull up to the drop-off sign. Dismissing children one at a time causes an increase in traffic and prevents other students from entering the school efficiently and on time. However, after 8:30 parents will need to park and escort their children to the office to be signed in as they will be marked tardy.

Students will be supervised when entering and exiting the school building. All car traffic should remain in the front of the building.
